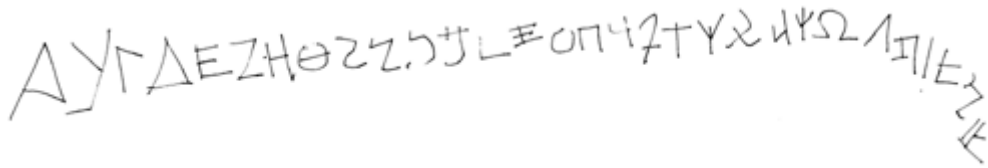

There are twenty-seventh signs in the Kirumb alphabet, which is based on a Semitic source, but with heavy replacement and addition from Greek. Very early signaries show different signs and different orders, but these were replaced by the standard above (which is the modern set) or minor variations of it, such as a lack of *Γ* or the use of *F* (digamma) for *vá*.
